Obituary

After undergoing his 1st brain surgery, Craig would transfer to the custodian department for Metro and be known to many on the rail system. Quago dabbled in fashion design and had a talent for creating his own unique style. Fly boy loved to dress!

In September of 1995, Craig would wed Marita and they were blessed with a baby girl Myla, whom he affectionately called MyMy. Craig could be confidently referred to as a family man. One who often spoke of and supported his family - actively spending time by correcting homework, picking the kids up from school and taking the gang to the 7Eleven. He always participated in school activities such as the Father & Daughter dance, as he loved to show off his little girl.

Known as the "Kissing Usher". He also served as a eucharistic minister, serving his parish community communion and sharing the gospel. Many would refer to him as the preacher, for he surely knew the Lord and could be found truly serving as a disciple. Many of those who were homeless could count on his great generosity. Most often, he accompanied his wife and daughter to feed the unwed mothers in city shelters. Craig always had a smile and hug for everybody and upon exiting could be heard saying, Love Joy Peace & Happiness!
